GUIDELINES FOR STARTING A BUSINESS IN PLATEAU STATE

In pursuant of PLATEAU State Citation and Revenue Administration Law, 2021, and , available online at <u>https://www.plateaustate.gov.ng/uploads/plateau-</u> <u>law/PLATEAU-STATE-INTERNAL-(CONSOLIDATED)-LAW%202020.pdf</u>, and Plateau State Governor Executive Order PLSG-10, 2020 available online at <u>https://www.plateaustate.gov.ng/uploads/plateau-law/EXECUTIVE-ORDER-2020-</u> <u>OSIC.pdf</u> all individuals and organizations seeking to start a small- to mediumsized limited liability company in PLATEAU State can apply through the following process, and guidelines:

STEP1 Public Search	Reserve a unique company name with Agency: Corporate Affairs Commission. The Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) online system was launched on February 2, 2015. This platform enables online unique name reservation and filing the incorporation forms for the entire registration process. As of March 2022, the process of reserving the company name can only be made online at: http://services.cac.gov.ng/ and payment	Less than one day (online procedure	NGN 500 reservation fee
STEP2	Reserve a name of your company with the CAC online at <u>Login CAC Pre-Incorporation</u>		
STEP 3	Pre-incorporation Prepare the requisite incorporation and pay the stamp duty Agency: FIRS e- stamping portal at https://www.stampduty.gov.ng/ As of 2022, the possibility of e-stamping became available. As such, companies can complete the stamping online. To prepare the requisite incorporation documents, the business founders must complete the Statutory forms, prepare, and print the memorandum	Less than one day (online procedure)	0.75% stamp duty paid on share capital + NGN 500 for each additional copy of Memorandum and Articles of Association stamped (2 copies)

and articles of association and have them stamped by the Federal Inland Revenue Service (FIRS) or online. The stamp duty payable on share capital (ad valorem) is 0.75% and NGN 500 for each additional copy of Memorandum and Articles of Association stamped. Corporate bodies including banks, MDAs or other persons		
needing an Application Programming Interface (API) integration may access www.stampduty.gov.ng/integration/ for necessary instruction.		
Sign the declaration of compliance before a Commissioner for Oaths or a Notary Public Agency: Notary Public or Commissioner of Oaths The declaration by the barrister or solicitor engaged in the formation of the company may be sworn to before a Notary Public for a fee of NGN 4,000 - NGN 5,000 or at any of the recognized courts in the country (Magistrate Court, the State High Court, or the Federal High Court) before a Commissioner for Oaths for a small fee of NGN 500 usually chargeable by the respective courts. Entrepreneurs can also use the services of a CAC-appointed lawyer.	1 day	NGN 500 at the court or NGN 4,000 - NGN 5,000 with a Notary Public
Register the company at the Corporate Affairs Commission, pay registration fees and receive the income tax and VAT registration number pay registration fees Agency: Corporate Affairs Commission as of May 2017, companies now apply for company incorporation using form CAC 1.1. This new form replaced form CAC 4: Declaration of compliance, form CAC 2: Statement of share capital and return of allotment of shares, form CAC 7: Particulars of directors, and form CAC 2.1: Particulars of the company secretary. The registration is now done entirely online. Incorporation fees are:

✓ NGN 2,000 for certified true copy of

Lawyers are usually hired to undertake the	
administrative incorporation procedures. On	
average, a lawyer will charge NGN 60,000 to	
handle the entire incorporation process in this	
state.	
Once the registration process is completed, a	
TIN is automatically generated and sent to one	
of the business founders by email. This number	
is the same for Income Tax and VAT.	
The payment of statutory filing fees can now	
be processed online through CAC Remita, an	
electronic payment platform at	
https://login.remita.net/remita/onepage/CAC/

Step 4 Register for personal income tax PAYE

All employers shall register with the Plateau		
State Internal Revenue Service for income tax		
withholding. The PAYE Regulations of 2021,		
made pursuant to the Personal Income Tax Act,		
provides that all employers are to register with		
the PLATEAU State Board of Internal Revenue		
Tax Office nearest to the registered company		
address to remit income tax deducted from		
their employees. The employer must , within 6		
months of commencing a business, deduct tax		
from the emoluments of employees and remit		
the amount deducted to any of the designated		
collecting banks. The registration requirements are as follows:		
1. A copy of certificate of incorporation.		
2. List of staff and their annual salaries.		
3. Letter of application for registration.		
4. Corporate income tax and VAT tax

	All employers shall register with the re state tax authority for income tax withholding. The PAYE Regulations of 2021 made pursuant to the Personal Income Tax Act provides that all employers are to register with the PLATEAU State Board of Internal Revenue Tax Office nearest to the registered company address for the purpose of remitting income tax deducted from their employees. The employer must , within 6 months of commencing a business, deduct tax from the emoluments of employees and remit the amount deducted to any		
	of the designated collecting banks. The registration requirements are as follows:		
	 A copy of certificate of incorporation. List of staff and their annual salaries. Letter of application for registration. Corporate income tax and VAT tax referencenumber. Upon completion of registration, an Employer's Identification Number will be issued. An employer who fails or refuses to register commits an offence and is liable on conviction to pay a NGN 15,000 fine in addition to the payment of arrears of the tax due. 		

Step 5	Register business premises with the PLATEAU State Government and pay at our business portal <u>https://psirs.gov.ng/</u> or any commercial Bank to the Plateau State Internal Revenue Services	1 day (simultaneous with previous procedure)	NGN 15,000
	To register the company premises with the PLATEAU State Government, the entrepreneur heads to any nationalized commercial bank with some evidence of the business premises (utility bills, etc.) and pays the business premise levy to the PLATEAU State Internal Revenue Services account. The bank then issues a receipt bearing the PLATEAU State Government logo. Business premises in an urban area of Nigeria must be registered on the payment of an NGN 15,000 registration fee in the first year of registration (NGN 5,000 per annum as renewal registration fees in the subsequent years). For rural areas, the business premises registration fee is NGN2,000 for the first year of registration (NGN 1,000 per annum as registration renewal fees for the subsequent years).		

Step 6 Collection of Permit to operate Business Successful applicants are notified via text, call or email within 2 days upon submission of listed documents above and evidence of payment pays the business premise levy and to collect the permit to operate business, successful applicants should visit the contact	
+2348067122700 to collect the business operating license certificate in person or issue an authorization letter duly signed by the applicant, attaching OSICs acknowledgment letter, passport of the applicant, and valid identity card of the representative authorized to collect permit. Where an applicant has not been notified of a successful application within 30 days, he/she should please get in touch with the PLATEAU STATE customer service phone number above or visit our office below .
